

Philadelphia June 4<sup>th</sup> 1825.

My Dear General,

You have served your country nobly; & you will perceive that the Genl. Assembly, consisting this year of more than 150 members, & being the largest ecclesiastical body in the world, is disposed to enlist you in the service of the church militant.

The foregoing appointment shows in what esteem the Presbyterian Church in the U.S. holds you. We wish to locate the Seminary in the best place for the welfare of the Church. It will probably soon have 100 students, and as it will do much to promote the temporal & spiritual interests of the plan in which it shall be located, it is probable that Cincinnati in Ohio, Washington & Chambersburgh in Pa, Chatham in Ohio, Maypsville & Shelbyville in Ky. & some other places, will make handsome proposals.

I would like to have a Seminary on your farm; but my present impression is, that if Cincinnati will give its College building & funds to the Seminary, that would be the plan. You are well acquainted with all the West, & can carefully examine them without a new visit to them.

I shall send you the Minutes of the Assembly when they are printed.
