Richmond Va Aug. 27. 1845

Reverend &amp; Dear Brother:

Your favor of the 22<sup>nd</sup> inst. is received. I am much pleased that you are coming to the University. I hope that God, who is the author of all good, has directed in this matter. You will be well received by all the people of the state with exceptions so limited as not to be worthy of serious notice. Since I last wrote you I have ceased to be a house-keeper & courtier, as I hoped to do, show you the hospitality of my house. Still you will find this the most convenient route to the University. I also see that the meeting of our Board of Directors of Union Seminary will take place on the 16<sup>th</sup> of Sept. & our presbytery meets on the 25<sup>th</sup>. These meetings may prevent me from being at home at the appointed time. But I think they will not. I shall endeavor to be here, as I am very anxious to see you. Besides I have much to call me here for a few weeks.
