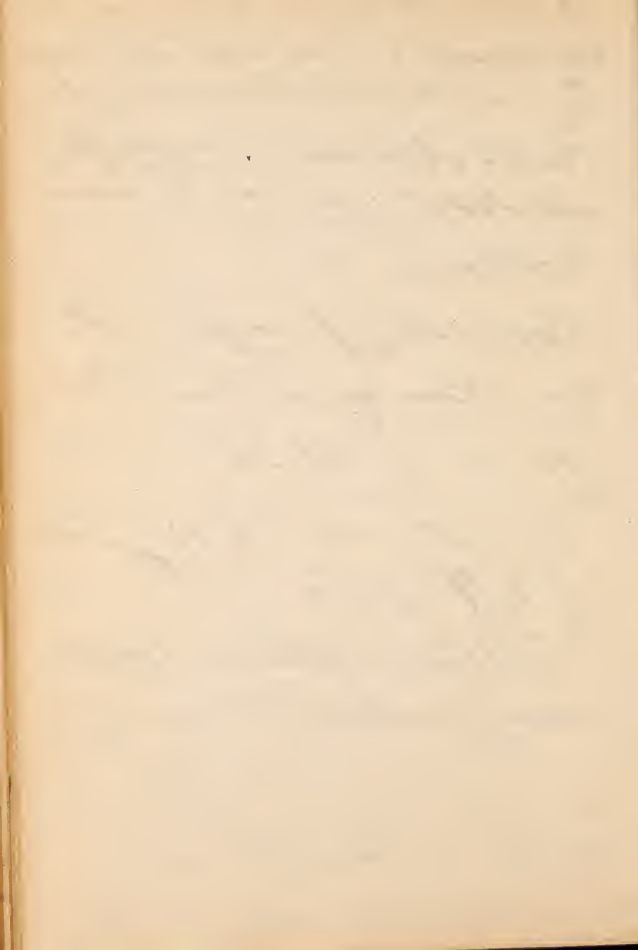

A SAD DROWNING ACCIDENT.

TRUMBULL, OF THE YALE CREW, AND COLONEL CHARLES M. COIT, DROWNED IN NEW LONDON HARBOR—LOST BY TRYING TO SAVE A DOY FROM DROWNING,

[BY TELEGRAPH TO THE HERALD.]

NEW LONDON, Conn., July 3, 1873.

David Trumbull, who pulled oar number seven in Yale boat in the recent Yale-Harvard University race, and Colonel Charles M. Coit, treasurer of the Dime Savings Bank, Norwich, were drowned in New London Harbor, midway between the Pegnot House and Fort Trumbull, at five o'clock this afternoon, under the following circumstances:—A party, consisting of the persons named above, and George D. Coit, treasurer of the Dime Savings Bank, Norwich, a brother of the deceased, and Thompson, of New York, and the young sons of the two Coits were sailing in the harbor in the sloop "Robert Charles." While running before the wind up the harbor the son of Colonel Coit fell overboard. His father and Mr. Trumbull immediately sprang into the water after him. The oars were thrown to the two sons; but being excellent swimmers they got them out by. Some minutes elapsed before the yacht could be brought around, and when it did reach the perilled party George Coit jumped overboard, seized the child, and both were drawn on board. The yacht meanwhile running on; and when again brought about at the spot where Coit and Trumbull were lost, the son—then the latter out of sight—while the body of the former, which had floated a few feet beneath the surface of the water, was hauled on board, and search for Trumbull's body was instituted by men from the shore, but up to this hour (nine P. M.) without success.

ATTEMPTED RESUSCITATION.

The yacht meanwhile came up to the city and five physicians were summoned, whose combined efforts, continued for nearly two hours, were insufficient to resuscitate the body of Colonel Coit, and it was given to the undertaker, who prepared it for burial, and it was afterward conveyed to his family in Norwich.

SKETCH OF COLONEL COIT.

Colonel Coit was a most estimable citizen, and during the war commanded the Eighth regiment of Connecticut volunteers. He was Postmaster of Norwich during a portion of Grant's first term. His age was about forty.

SKETCH OF MR. TRUMBULL.

Mr. David Trumbull, who had been the guest of Mr. George D. Coit since the regatta, was twenty-five years of age and the son of the Rev. David Trumbull, of Watpatrio, Chih. He graduated in the academic department of Yale in '76 and was in the class of '76 in Yale Theological School. He was starboard oar and the oldest member of the Yale crew, and was considered one of the best men in the boat. It is believed that the men were chilled by remaining in the water so long, and were stricken with cramps. The affair has created intense excitement here.

CREEDMOOR.

THE EIGHTH REGIMENT IN CAMP ON RANGE—PRACTICE FOR THE MARKS- BADGE.

The large open space near the entrance of Creedmoor Range and to the west of the long firing points has during the past week been the spot in the enclosure owned by the National Rifle Association. A large quantity of canvas was spread over the ground and a small forest of poles suddenly appeared. The *habitués* of the range were puzzled by unexpected appearances, and speculation was rife concerning their purpose. A few days ago, however, the mystery was solved by the appearance of a long banner on the tallest pole, bearing the words "Camp Robinson." The poles, canvas and canvas were designed for the construction of 150 tents, which the Eighth regiment of this city will occupy in their quarters yesterday, with the intention of remaining until next Monday. The regiment began to assemble at the State Arsenal, Thirty-fifth street and Seventh avenue, and at two P. M., there were about three hundred men in line. All the baggage of the regiment was taken to Creedmoor on the previous day, so that the men were unencumbered and presented a fine military appearance as they marched to the Thirty-fourth street ferry. On the other side a special train took them to Creedmoor.

IN CAMP.

On their arrival at Creedmoor they were marched to the camp and assigned to quarters. The Colonel and members of the staff front on "Longfellow avenue," a broad thoroughfare running the western side of the camp. The other streets are named Farragut, Dix, Grant, Edsforth, Hancock, Kearney and Anderson. The men immediately voted their attention to the arrangement of their tents, with the exception of three marksmen who were ordered to proceed to the 200 yards firing points, to commence practice for the Marksman's Badge.

BEFORE THE BUTTS.

During the practice Captain Edward Barkley, regimental inspector of rifle practice, took charge of this detachment. The shooting was at 200 yards and was rendered pretty difficult by a "strong wind," which blew up the range. The following succeeded in winning the badge before the close of the day:—Corporal S. THE OLD CHURCHES IN NEW ENGLAND. It is a curious fact—a fact which different readers will be disposed to account for in different ways, but still a fact—that the old, original, Calvinistic churches in this old historical portion of New England are almost all now in the hands of that denomination which is furthest removed, in faith, from the early Calvinistic Congregationalism of New England. Not only is the first church in Plymouth Unitarian, and the first church in Dorchester Unitarian, and the first church in Boston Unitarian, but, when we come nearer home, to the ancient county of Essex, we find the following oldest churches in the following oldest settlements now supporting Unitarian preaching. We give them with the dates of their origin: First Church, Salem, 1629; First Church, Gloucester, 1642; First Church, North Andover, 1645; First Church, Haverhill, 1645; First Church, Beverly, 1667; Second Church, Marblehead, 1716; East Church, Salem, 1717; First Church, Newburyport, 1725. This is a curious list, and it would be interesting to note how far the same rule obtains in other counties and parts of New England. There are, in Massachusetts, about forty Unitarian societies which date their origin before A. D. 1700, of which the oldest is that of Plymouth, organized at Leyden in 1602. Some of these are (1630) Boston, Watertown, Dorchester, Roxbury; (1632) Duxbury; (1634) Scituate; (1635) Hingham; (1636) Concord, Sudbury; (1637) Taunton; (1638) Dedham, Sandwich; (1639) Barnstable, Quincy; and (1638), Portsmouth, N. H. [Salem (Mass.) Gazette.

ASPASIA. All educated women, and many men, feel an interest in the character of Aspasia, who has been much misrepresented and generally misunderstood even by students of Grecian history. She has generally been portrayed as what the Athenians called a *hetaira*, or woman of the outcast class, which she by no means was, and was never so considered. Recent investigations have placed the most remarkable woman of antiquity in a truer and better light. She was born at Miletus, a city of Asia Minor, situated in the northern part of Caria, but politically belonging to the Ionian Confederacy. She was, therefore, a foreigner, and the fact that in Athens all foreign women were equally disesteemed, and that their children, even when born in wedlock, were always regarded as illegitimate, has given her an odiously false reputation. She was not at all conventional, for conventionality demanded that Athenian matrons should remain within the seclusion of their own homes. After her marriage to Pericles, who had parted from his first wife with her own full consent, her house became the resort of all the learned and distinguished men—Socrates among the rest—of the polite capital. Her husband whom the Athenian law, strictly construed, would not have recognized as such, was honored with the title of Olympian Jove, and she was designated as Juno. Her eloquence and familiarity with politics were extraordinary, and her great gifts naturally excited envy. The comic and other authors have done her gross injustice. Hermippus, the comedian, profited by a brief irritation of the Athenians against Pericles to accuse his wife of impiety; but her husband's eloquence procured a triumphant acquittal of the malicious charges. Her influence over Pericles, though necessarily strong, has evidently been exaggerated, and even caricatured. Aristophanes has declared that she was the cause of the Samian and Peloponnesian wars; but Plutarch vindicates her from the calumny, and Thucydides, who furnishes minute details of the latter contest, does not mention her name in connection with it. Her marriage to Lycicles, a cattle dealer, after Pericles's death, has been used to her disadvantage, and an attempt made to show her mental and moral decline. But Lycicles was a considerable personage, and cattle dealing was not only a lucrative but a dignified and important calling in ancient Greece, and through her he rose to eminence. The life of Aspasia needs to be newly written. [New York Times.

The Postal Law.

A number of important changes in the postal law went into effect May 1st. They are as follows:
The postage on *all* second class matter is 2 cents per pound.

Periodicals bound in board, cloth, leather or other *substantial* bindings, such as distinguish printed books for preservation from periodical publications, *cannot pass* in the mail at the pound rates.

The limit of weight to four pounds is waived in the case of a *single* book weighing more than that limit. Circulars can be addressed, dated, signed, and typographical errors corrected in writing, and the postage will be 1 cent for each *two* ounces, instead of 1 cent for *one* ounce as heretofore.

Proof-sheets and corrected proof sheets, and manuscript copy *accompanying* the same, may be sent in the mail at the rate of 1 per cent. for each *two* ounces. (This provision does not admit manuscript *unaccompanied* by the proof-sheet.)

There may be placed upon the cover or blank leaves of any book or of any printed matter of the third class a simple manuscript dedication or inscription that does not partake of the nature of a personal correspondence.

Upon any package of matter of the fourth class the sender may write or print his own name and address, preceded by the word "from," and there may also be written or printed the number and names of the articles enclosed; and the sender thereof may write or print upon or attach to any such articles by tag or label, a mark, number, name or letter, for the purpose of identification.
